


Quick Guide for Australian Students


Fast-track options

Deakin College diploma courses offer a fast-track option, allowing you to complete a program in just eight months. This makes it possible to enter university much earlier than students studying in a conventional pathway program.



Small class and tutorial groups

Small class sizes are one of the benefits of studying at Deakin College. With a maximum of 30 students per class, complemented by small group tutorials and workshops, you will receive intensive academic contact and support.



*Entry to Deakin University is based on successful completion of a Deakin College diploma with a WAM of 50 (except the Bachelor of Laws which requires a higher WAM). Some degrees, such as the undergraduate engineering courses or Bachelor of Laws will take longer than 3 years to complete.

Some diplomas require on-campus attendance.

#New students can study this diploma at Melbourne Burwood in 2024 if they are on a pathway to the Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) majoring in Environmental Engineering, Mechanical Engineering and Mechatronics Engineering only. New students on a pathway to the Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) majoring in Civil Engineering or Electrical and Electronics Engineering cannot study this diploma at Melbourne Burwood in 2024.

Entry requirements

Applicants with higher education study

Completion or part completion of an Australian higher education qualification or equivalent

Applicants with vocational education and training (VET) study

Completion or part completion of an Australian VET qualification or equivalent

Applicants with secondary education

Satisfactory completion of VCE, VCE VM or the equivalent from any Australian state or territory Foundation Program; International Baccalaureate with a score of 22 or above; A levels; or other international equivalents.

Diploma of Engineering and Diploma of Information Technology + Bachelor of Artificial Intelligence applicants only: Units 3 and 4 in one of VCE Mathematical Methods, Further Mathematics or Specialist Mathematics with a study score of at least 20; or equivalent.

If there have been circumstance that have made it hard for you to do your best at study, you should consider putting in a special consideration application via VTAC's Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS).

Applicants with work and life experience

Applicants are assessed on the basis of work experience relevant to the program; determined by type and level of employment, details of employer and length of employment. References and/or a statement from the employer substantiating the work claim are required.

Applicants are also required to submit a short statement articulating how they will use the knowledge, skills, abilities and personal qualities gained through life experience to succeed in their chosen course.

If applicants are unable to demonstrate work experience, Deakin College will require an interview.



How to apply

Apply through VTAC:

Current Year 12 students applying for the March intake should apply through the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC). For more information visit:

Apply directly to Deakin College:

March Intake

As an Australian student, you can apply directly to Deakin College in the following circumstances:

- You are not currently studying a standard Australian Year 12 curriculum and you do not plan to apply to more than one institution or for more than one course at Deakin College; or
- The VTAC Change of Preference rounds have ended.

June and October Intakes

All Australian students can apply direct to Deakin College for these intakes
